Parent Questionnaire Results- Week 1 Feedback

25 out of 26 respondents agreed or strongly agreed that their child is happy at this school. 1 respondent did not know.

25 out of 26 respondents agreed or strongly agreed that their child felt safe at this school. 1 respondent disagreed.

23 out of 26 respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the school makes sure its pupils are well behaved. 1 respondent disagreed and 2 said they did not know.

24 out of 26 respondents agreed or strongly agreed that their child has access to clubs and activities at this school. 2 respondents disagreed.

Your suggestions for further development:

- There are no after school sports run by teachers (only sports' partnership which has to be paid for). There's no drama, music, dance and only recently has been art and sewing taken on by TAs at lunchtime. I think 'Ethos' has its place but should be covered in RE and PSHE in class time. We should be inspiring children to find out what they're good at and n talent in a wide range of areas.
- Geography club to be extended as my child really enjoyed it.
- More extra-curricular team sports and sport in general to promote active lifestyles.
- Enhanced music provision-appears to be little music provision in curriculum.
- More school trips.
- Forest School.

Many of you recognised the wide variety of clubs that we offer as a school. In the 22/23 year, we have offered: Sports' Partnership, KS1 Multi-Skills, KS1 Geography, Library Café, Chess, Sewing, Lego, Ethos, Rotary Award, Rounders, Cricket, Football, School Council, Computing, Production, Art, Disco Dodgeball, Choir and Before and After School Club. As a small school with a small staff, who run clubs voluntarily in their lunch breaks or after school, we hope you agree this is a comprehensive offer. We try to rotate the offer of clubs throughout the year to appeal to as many pupils as possible.

Additionally, we track attendance at clubs and sporting competitions closely. We have found that clubs offered after school are poorly attended with between 6-10 children attending on average; whereas lunchtime clubs regularly have between 20-30 children

We will also continue to change the offer of what's on throughout the year to meet the needs of pupils. When asked in school pupils said their favourite clubs were: Cricket,

Geography, Ethos, Library Café, Sports' Partnership, Rounders, Chess, Sewing, Football, Choir, Computing, Worry Warriors, School Council, Art and Before & After School Clubpretty much every club that has been offered! We also asked the children for ideas for clubs they would like to see this year. They have requested a lot of the same clubs plus a few extras which we are going to aim to timetable in.

I am pleased to say that Forest school will return for all classes this year when our new Forest School leader completes her training. The Forest School qualification is a comprehensive course involving a huge amount of study, training and assessments through essay writing so takes up to a year to complete. Mrs Parkinson has been working very hard the past few months on completing her training and is excited to get started properly.

We have had a return to taking classes out on trips in 22/23, although it has been difficult to arrange this for all classes. Every class has been on at least one trip and plans are] already in place for 23/24. Additionally, we have had a whole host of visitors into school and again have some exciting days planned for 23/24.

We are working with the new Ormskirk Music Hub to provide more musical opportunities in school. Every class already has one hour of music per week and Year 6 engaged with the endangered brass project in 22/23. Additionally Years 3 and 4 took part in the Big Sing through the music hub and all classes have taken part in live performances throughout the year.
