Attendance Matters

Firstly, a huge thank you to all of those families that are committed to their child attending regularly at school. We really appreciate your support. We have many pupils already on track for attendance of 97% or above.

If a child of compulsory school age is registered at a school it is essential that they attend school regularly to allow them to fulfil their potential. As a school, we want all our children to achieve and we are

constantly looking at ways of improving our systems for that to happen.

For a school to be considered to have good attendance we must have attendance of at least 97%.

Our current school attendance is 95.3%.

We are very concerned about this and have made it a key target for our school to improve attendance over the course of 23/24. We can only achieve this by working together. Attendance is monitored weekly and we will contact families where we have cause for concern for a pupil's attendance. Governor

Attendance Panels are offered to families where attendance has become a serious concern so that we can offer appropriate support.

Every single day a child is absent from school, equates to a day of lost learning. Attendance percentages can be misleading. For some parents 90% attendance may seem like an acceptable level of attendance. However, the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a day of school each week or 19 days of school during the school year. That is nearly four school weeks. We are working really hard to encourage children to come to school every single day. We can cope with colds and headaches in school and would encourage you to send your child into school if at all possible.

Attendance will be celebrate in school each week in class with the class with the highest attendance each week receiving a reward.

Already this year we have received a large number of holiday requests. Unfortunately, holidays in term time cannot be authorised and may result in a penalty notice being issued. There are 175 non-school days in a year and we urge parents to make use of these days for family holidays.

If your child is unable to attend school for any reason, please phone school or email

bursar@wlsj.lancs.sch.uk before 9.30am to inform us. This should be done every morning of a pupil's absence.
